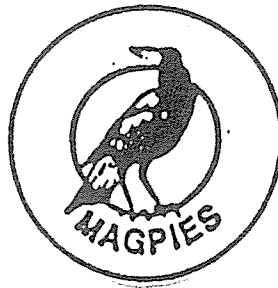

Senior 1 - Jo Buck

Coaching the Senior 1 team this season has been a most rewarding experience for me. Unlike season 1997, I was able to concentrate fully on coaching a single team in a specific grade and this enabled me to focus more fully on the task at hand. And my task was made so much easier by having a band of players who trained hard and were committed to doing their best each week. It was an added bonus to have Janette Schwartzkopff alongside of me coaching the Senior 2's, and together I think we made a good team.

We began our pre-season work in February in the pool which was most welcome considering the heat. We combined our pool fitness work with some court play to determine squads as quickly as possible. From season '97's team there were a few gaps to fill - but these were soon filled with some eager young U17's and the odd retiree.

The girls combined well as a team and the season ahead looked promising. We played Gawler Centrals in round 1 and our confidence soared as we won that game by 54 goals. But we were quickly put in our place in round 2 when we met Nuriootpa. In a more tightly contested game we eventually succumbed to Nuri's persistence and lost 38-33. From here we only dropped one more game in the first half of the season finishing in second place at the halfway mark.

In theory then, we really should have finished second at the end of the season - we could afford the same two losses. However not only did we lose again to Nuriootpa, again by a margin of 5 goals, but we had a costly loss to Kapunda by the narrowest of margins in the second to last round of the season. So much had hinged on the win the week before at South it all blurred into insignificance as Kapunda took up the challenge of beating us and relegating us to third position at the end of the day. And by the time we played Freeling in the last round we only managed to salvage fourth position and a spot in the first semi.

We came up against a determined South who we had defeated twice previously - last both wins had been by marrow margins so the work still had to be done. I decided to change our combination slightly for this match and hopefully catch them off-guard. To a degree I think this worked but in the end it became a game of wits, and who broke down first was liable to lose. South made the mistakes, gave us a look-in and the rest is history.

Our preliminary final game was against Nuriootpa and I had plenty in terms of stimulus to win the game. We honestly felt we were a better side, that we hadn't performed at our best on our previous encounters and ultimately we wanted to have another go at Freeling in the final. The girls played an excellent first half, especially the second quarter. Unfortunately Nuriootpa came back strongly in the third and we never quite regained our composure after that.

And so the season came to an abrupt finish with us making third position overall in season 1998.

Ultimately there is a distinct feeling of disappointment that we didn't go further with a team that, on their day, reminded me of the courage and determination of the Crows. South Gawler brought "the crow" out of my girls this year and it was unfortunate we didn't repeat such performances again against our other two rivals.

Thankyou to all the girls in the Senior 1 team this year. Thanks for supporting me, for listening to me, for accepting my decisions. Congratulations to the trophy winners - Nikia Gepp (Best & Fairest), Lyn Hoklas (Runner-Up) and Amy Rohrlach (Rookie Of The Year). Congratulations too to Kate Klingner who won Best & Fairest award for Jaguars U17's in Adelaide. Thanks to Kate and her folks who managed to get Kate from Adelaide to wherever each week - it was great to have that extra flexibility in our squad and I appreciated the effort and sacrifice made each week. To Kristin and Leanne - two great defenders who both had very consistent seasons and who always worked so hard. And down the other end, thanks to Emma and

Robyn who were placed under extreme pressure each week. These two girls combined well and demonstrated the strength of having youth and experience.

Thanks to the Management Committee for all their effort this season. Thanks again to Janette during our finals campaign. To the parents who scored and supported us each week - thankyou also. Never underestimate your support role - it is vital and greatly appreciated.
