2017 SA Regional Championships

Previously we have been affiliated with Lower Light Academy but this year that changed and we are now affiliated with *Central Ranges Netball Academy*.

This year the structure of all regional academies also has changed. It was to be run in the three different age groups (u13, u15, u17) now it is being ran as one squad of ages 14 - 16.

The age requirements have also changed and you must have turned 14 before 30th September 2017 and cannot turn 17 before November 1st 2017.

This new age group has been decided as it followed the Develop a Diamond program as well as aligning with the State team age groups.

Academy players are selected through open trials that take place in February/March each year when a squad of between 20 to 40 players are selected. The squad trains once a month, following a National skills, fitness and netball theory program. From this all players are selected for one of the three divisions to participate in the Academy Games.

Tanunda Netball Club would like to recognise and award Life Membership to a person who has been associated with the Club since 1994 – Tracey Hoklas.

Tracey began her netball career with the Tanunda Netball Club in 1994 as Tracey Oates. Not sure if she followed her man, tracked her man or found her man at Tanunda but within a couple of years she became Hoklas and the rest is history.

So in 1994 she began a four year stint in the Senior 2 team and also began her Tanunda Netball Club Trophy Collection by winning Most Improved. In 1996 a highlight was playing in her first Premiership Team for Tanunda. This Senior 2 Premiership was 26 years in the making and completed a double header for the Club that year, also capturing the Senior 1 flag in this season. Tanunda had not won a Senior 2 flag since 1970. The team was a mix of youth and premiership experience - Gayle Dawkins was her Captain and of course she experienced superior coaching!!

In 1998 Tracey was selected to play in the Senior 3 squad and almost immediately experienced success as this team played through to play off in the Grand Final but being the runner-up was all that was available that day. 1999 was a significant year for Tracey as she not only Captained a team to a Premiership but on a personal level also won the team's Best and Fairest Award. You have to cherish years such as this!! In 2001 she again played in Senior 3, was the Team Manager and won another personal award this time as Best Team Player. Tracey's name is missing from the books in 2000 and 2002 and I am thinking these were baby years.....But Tracey, what were you thinking? You played Senior 3 in 2001 and yet in 2003 you "dropped" to Senior 6. Whoever was on the selection panel knew what they were doing as Tanunda won the Senior 6 Premiership that year and Tracey scored another personal prize as Best and Fairest Runner-up.

Obviously ridiculed for "stacking" their team Tracey found herself back in the Senior 4 team for the next 8 years in what was to be a successful time for Tracey personally. In 2004 she won the Best and Fairest Runner-up Trophy for her team as well as polling similarly well in the Association and finishing 2nd Runner-up for the Association this year. In 2005 the Senior 4 team ran out Premiers and in 2006 Tracey once again won the Best and Fairest Runner-up Trophy.

In 2012 she once again Captained the Senior 4's to the Grand Final but had to be satisfied with being runner-ups that year. She was once again a trophy winner this year receiving the 2nd Runner-up Award. 2013 saw Tracey selected in Senior 5, winning the Best and Fairest Runner-up trophy and playing her 250th milestone game during the season. Congratulations!

2014 was another big year for Tracey as she coached not one but two teams, Senior 6 and 7, played in 6's and was awarded the Wohlers Club Service Award.

In 2015, Tracey perhaps felt her playing days were over and she settled into coaching the Senior 4's. But the playing bug got to her and she returned to the court as a player in 2016 with immediate team success, playing in the Senior 7 Premiership team. 2017 saw her hit the court again and once again being in a Grand Finalist team and finishing the year with 298 games to her name.

As a player, Tracey has played 298 games and played 20 seasons of netball for her Club. But in her time with the club Tracey has also dedicated numerous seasons to coaching. In 1998 she coached Junior 2 with Michelle Graetz to the Grand Final; in 1999 she coached the Junior 2's again, and again they were Grand Finalists; 2005 she coached Junior 1's; 2010 she coached Senior 4's; 2014 coached Senior 6 and 7's; 2015 coached Senior 4's. She has been a Team Manager, she has been a Committee member and she has consistently been an umpire for her club.

Despite living in a male dominated household, Tracey has maintained her connection to the Tanunda Netball Club for 24 years. She demonstrates a love of the game of netball; she is a loyal club member; she is a terrific example of a team player. She works hard at training; she encourages others; she is humble; she loves to win. And she has been prepared to share her skills and time for the benefit of others, both juniors and seniors over time.

I have experienced playing in a team with Tracey and have coached her. I know she is someone I can rely on; I know she puts team in front of herself; I know she gives all she can; I know she is a dedicated Tanunda Netball Club person. Membership of a Club is not just about playing games but also about giving back.

Tracey - congratulations on being recognised and awarded the highest honour in any Club, that of Life Membership.

The core group of these girls came together again this year with ONE goal in mind, and that was to win the 2017 flag. After feeling the pain of losing the 2016 Grand Final, finishing 2nd was never going to be an option this year. We were determined to do whatever it took to win the 2017 Senior 6 Premiership.

As a team, we put together a game plan which saw us work towards and achieve our ultimate goal. We made sure we could excel at a few basic netball principals and establish some consistency in our match play.

Throughout the season, we had our usual bouts of colds and flu, holidays/ weekend getaways, and minor injuries / niggles. We got off to a flying start this season, and remained undefeated for the first half of the minor round. The girls showed increasing confidence and belief in themselves & the overall team plan. One of our key phrases this season was "Start in front – Finish in front". This was drilled in to each player week in and week out. (Along with the phrase "I love Netball").

Our defensive game grew stronger and in particular our goal ring defenders became a formidable force with Mel, Sarah and Nicole combining well.

Round 11 versus Nuriootpa - saw our first game with a player out with injury due to finger surgery (Belinda Petersen). She was to miss 4 weeks (3 games in total, thanks to a bye) but this allowed a good opportunity for Di Bartsch and Linda Morgan to form a strong combination in our attacking goal ring.

Round 12 versus Gawler Centrals – saw us lose our first and ONLY game for the season (by 17 goals). It was a bitter pill to swallow and the whole team knew what they had to do both individually, and as a team to get back on top.

The determination, self-belief, maturity and experience that shone through, particularly in the second half of the season was exciting to watch. Not one of these girls was going to rest until the job was done.

Round 15 versus Kapunda – saw us land our first major injury. Kate Ton went down with a partial rupture of her (L) knee ACL. This was devastating for our mid court, we lost some versatility, but Lisa Manning and Natalie Payne stepped up to the plate and ran out the season as WA and C.

Round 16 versus Willaston – saw another season ending injury when Sarah Chipman went down with a complete rupture of her (R) knee ACL. Our formidable last line of defence was suddenly depleted. Di Bartsch, as a true team player stepped into the GK role to finish this game, and as it turned out to finish the rest of the season.

We were essentially down to 7 players for the remainder of season 2017.

The entire team was gutted with these injuries, but everyone kept their focus. We dusted ourselves off and were more determined than ever to overcome these challenges and set out to achieve our ultimate goal.

Our final game of the minor round (Round 17) versus Angaston allowed the team to familiarise with and settle into the new combination. This combination was to remain unchanged for the finals series.

Second Semi-Final – versus Gawler Centrals – was a tight and very physical contest, as it had been all year. We successfully earned a place in the Grand final with a win – final score 45-41.

I was finding that they wouldn't talk on the court and wouldn't encourage each other. In round 11 when we played Nuri and I told the girls to concentrate on talking on the court, calling for the ball when they were free and encouraging each other. I think that was one the best games the girls played. The way the ball came down the court was so great because of the girls using their voices.
