NEW Indigenous Round

This year has seen an introduction to the Indigenous Round of netball. This round was played on Saturday 9th July 2022 at Nuriootpa.

Below is a copy of the Indigenous design that local artist Ashleigh Bruza has designed for TNC and below are further details in relation to the meaning around the design. We would like to thank Ashleigh for her beautiful work and all of our players were extremely proud to be wearing the bibs that day.



The artwork is influenced by the country where Tanunda is located and highlights the following:

- The magpie the team's mascot and native bird that is plentiful in the Barossa.
 - Magpies are known to symbolise positivity and success.
- Tanunda meaning waterhole or many water birds and this is depicted in the design of from the bottom left-hand side of flowing water that pools behind the magpie.
 - Magpie tracks signifying the bird's presence on country
- Along the flowing lines are campsites/resting places representing the First Nations people of the region.
- Community and spirit is depicted on the top left-hand corner of the design as community gathering is a significant part of local sport and presence in country towns.
 - lastly on the top right-hand side of the artwork, the constellation Pleiades or "The Seven Sisters" is depicted. The seven sisters and their connection are influenced by their connection to water and femininity.

Welcome to the 2022 Annual General Meeting for the Tanunda Netball Club. I would like to thank our volunteers, members, sponsors, and supporters along with our dedicated management committee.

This past season has not been without its challenges, navigating through high junior player numbers and low senior player numbers, and some minor hiccups due to Covid19. As a club I believe we have managed the different circumstances as best as we could, but we may not have got it 100% right for everyone involved.

Participation

We filled teams from senior 1 to 5 and all Grades from Inters down, with most Junior teams running with squads of 9 or more players. We have experienced the most significant growth at the club in junior grades for many years. We recognise that this growth has come with challenges, and we are looking at specific processes to manage this in 2023. We had six teams participate in finals this season (senior 5, Inter 1 & 2, Junior 2, Sub Junior 1 & 2) with 2 teams playing on Grand Final day (Junior 2 & Sub Junior 2). Congratulations to all the teams who made finals. A special mention goes to Junior 2 player Lara Manning who was awarded Best on Court during the grand final. In addition, our Primary 2 team were presented with Association medallions for being 1st in their grade.

Facilities

You will see changes at the Tanunda Rec Park precinct, with the next stage of development getting underway. We are looking forward to the new buildings – changerooms, first aid rooms, toilets & showers along with a function room and an Office for us to use. It will be sad when we need to move out of the current clubrooms, but we looking forward to the new development. Please be patient and understanding whilst there might be times when access to the oval/courts may be impacted due to the development works. We will try to give notice about any extra inconvenience so you can prepare a workaround.

Umpire, Coach & Player development

We are pleased to see many coaches work through the coaching pathway and achieving accreditation. The club will be encouraging **all** coaches to have the accreditation – there are many useful resources available via those courses. We trust our coaches to be passionate and to develop our players in all age groups to be the best players they can be. Unfortunately the weather was not kind to us that day, but all participants had a great time, and I am sure every player and coach took something from that day. We need to see some more players taking on the umpiring duty, without umpires there is no game. For some of you that have been umpiring for a while and don't have a Badge, I would encourage you to think about taking that next step.

Each season the Tanunda Netball Club recognises players who have performed well over the season. We celebrate premierships, we recognise our umpires and we give awards for Club service. The highest honour anyone can receive is a Life Membership.

Currently the Club has awarded 23 Life Memberships. 4 Life Members are deceased – Kay Hueppauff, Edna Behrndt, Thelma Murphy and Marjorie Lehmann. We have 4 mother/daughter Life Members - Kay Hueppauff and Lyn Lindner, Kathy Marschall and Gabrielle Marschall, Marjorie Lehmann and Sharon Seedsman, Sue Martin and Toni Martin.

Tonight the Tanunda Netball Club would like to recognise and award Life Membership to a player who played her first game for the Club in 1982 as an 8 year old. I am certain there were rules about what age girls could be registered but knowing her mother she simply ignored them! 40 years on she becomes the 24th Life Member of the Tanunda Netball Club and creates the 5th mother/daughter Life Member combo – Congratulations Nicole Owen.

Our records are a tad thin during the 80s when Nicole was playing in juniors. As an 8 year old the only team then was Sub-Juniors. In fact she played 20% of her netball career in sub-juniors!! In 1983 Nicole played in Sub-Junior 2's and won the Most Consistent trophy that season. In 1984, still in the Sub-Junior 2 team Nicole experienced her first premiership playing alongside Melissa Hicks, Tracey Atze, Tracey Schneider, Amy Miller, Dianne and Karla Heidenreich. Her coach was Tina Thiele, she played GS and she also won the Most Consistent Award that year.

In 1985 she was still only 11 and so still qualified for Sub-Juniors and I am unsure what division but can report in 1986 she played in Sub-Junior 1's and won the Runner-up Best and Fairest trophy that season. She was also selected to represent the Barossa Light and Gawler at Country Championships in the under 15 squad.

Having fulfilled her apprenticeship in the U13 competition Nicole finally found herself in the U15 competition and her next highlight came in 1988 when her Junior 1 team finished top of the premiership ladder at the end of the season. Tanunda went in favourites on Grand Final Day but in a close tussle they went down to Riverton, 21-20. Personally she still caught the eyes of the umpire and won Best on Court on the day and also won Best and Fairest for her team on presentation night. As a result she also won the Hentschke Trophy with 25 votes, an award to the player who polled the highest amount of votes within the whole Club. Nicole was also a junior nominee for the B&L Sports Person of the Year.

In 1989, at age 15, Nicole found herself registered for Seniors. At this point there doesn't appear to have been an Under 17 competition in our Barossa competition. The club only registered 6 senior teams and 5 junior teams. Subscriptions were \$25 for Seniors and \$10 for Juniors and Levene was secretary! Nicole eventually found herself in the Senior 3 squad along with Rebecca Steinborner, Tracey Schneider, Cindy Schroeder and even her mum Levene. It was a big step for the junior girls. It was no surprise all four of these youngsters were selected to play in the U17 team for Country Champs, and coached by Jenny Johns, made their way into the Grand Final but lost by 1 goal to Port Pirie. On the home front the Senior 3's finished the minor round in third spot. They made their way into the Grand Final and coached by Neil Tarca the girls won a nail biter, defeating Gawler Centrals by the smallest of margins. Nicole also won the Best and Fairest Club award for Senior 3.

Finishing Secondary School, Nicole moved to the City like many of our students did at that time. She studied, travelled, developed a career, girl meets boy, boy asks question, Nicole Fechner becomes Nicole Owen and together they had a family. 17 years later she moves back home and returns to netball, picking up where she left off in Senior 3.

Since 2007 Nicole has played every season. Her personal highlights include winning Most Consistent Senior 4, 2010; 2nd Runner-up Senior 4, 2011; Best and Fairest Senior 5, 2012; Most Consistent Senior 5, 2013 as well as celebrating 150 games; Best and Fairest Runner-up Senior 6, 2016; playing in Senior 6 Premiership team 2017; Undefeated Premiers Senior 6 in 2018, and winning Best on Court Grand Final Day and topping off the season winning the Best and Fairest Trophy that season; 2019 she was part of a co-hort of players who chose to stick by the Club finding herself back in Senior 3 and doing some hard yards to keep Tanunda Netball Club alive and in 2021 she reached her 250th game. And she has started the cycle all over again as she watches her young daughters begin their netball careers.

Nicole has certainly demonstrated she is a dedicated and loyal Tanunda Netball Club person. She has a long history with the Club and is a real team player.

Tonight the Tanunda Netball Club would like to recognise and award Life Membership to a player who played her first game for the Club in 1988. 35 years on she becomes the 25th Life Member of the Tanunda Netball Club – Congratulations Nikia Schwarz.

From the very beginning Nikia demonstrated she had exceptional netball skills and these skills were nurtured by coaches who they themselves displayed exceptional netball skills. Here I would also like to recognise Cheryl Kraehenbuhl, Kathy Marschall, Celia Fielke and Kristen Falkenberg.

In 1988 Nikia played in Sub-Junior 3's coached by Cheryl. The team finished top of the Premiership table with a percentage of 88.5% with the next highest percentage being 64.1%. The team played Kapunda on Grand Final Day and won 16–12. Nikia wore her regulation "C" bib in the premiership photo and on a personal level she won the club Best and Fairest.

In 1989 Nikia played Sub-Junior 2 coached by Kathy Marschall and the girls ran our winners on Grand Final day defeating Eudunda 27 – 13.

In 1990 our records are extremely thin......Levene was secretary but she took sick leave unexpectedly early in the season leaving a President floundering. What we do know is that Nikia played in another Premiership team, this time Sub-Junior 1's, she won Best on Court Grand Final day and the team also won the Goal Throwing Trophy for the Association.

In 1991 Nikia was selected in Junior 1 – Coach Marschall knew who she wanted in her side – they went on to play Nuriootpa in the Grand Final and finished with the desired result, 50 – 29. Nikia once again won Best on Court and team also won the Goal Throwing Trophy for the Association.

In 1992 Nikia played Junior 1 and won a fifth successive premiership. She was also selected to represent the Association at Country Championships in the Under 15 side and coached by Lynette Hutton. This team made the Grand Final but lost to an extremely talented Northern Areas. Once again Nikia's skills did not go unrecognised as she was selected in the Regional Team.

1993 marks the beginning of The Annual Report and from here our records as a Club are more complete and here I would like to recognise Kieran Roche who instigated and created our very first Annual Report. An excellent initiative.

Nikia had obviously captured the attention of senior coaches and in 1993 she went from a Junior player in 1992 to Play Senior 2. She played 3 seasons in Senior 2 and each year took out an award – in '93 she won Best and Fairest Runner-Up, and Best and Fairest in both 1994 and 1995.

In 1996 Nikia was selected to play in the Senior 1 team. Celia Fielke was the coach and assisted by Neil Tarca. Competition to make the top side was fierce and when players like Leslie Grieger, Nikki Krieg and Elissa Leske were in the Senior 2 side Tanunda enjoyed depth and flexibility. It was therefore no surprise when Tanunda won both the Senior 1 and Senior 2 premiership, the 1's defeating Freeling 56 – 52. On a personal level Nikia won the Coaches Trophy's.

Nikia continued to maintain her position in the Senior 1 side until 2003. She continued to impress coaches and umpires alike winning numerous personal awards. In 1997 she won Senior 1 Best and Fairest and shared the award for the Wohler's Most Successful Player with Gayle Dawkins. In 1998 she again won Senior 1 Best and Fairest. In 2001 she won Senior 1 Best and Fairest Runner-up and also Best and Fairest Runner-up for the Association. She duplicated this win in 2002, winning Senior 1 Best and Fairest Runner-up and sharing Best and Fairest Runner-up for the Association with fellow team member Elissa Leske.

In 2003, her final season in Senior 1, she was nominated as Captain of her side and won the Best and Fairest Trophy. From here she stepped away from netball to start her family.

In 2015 the Schwarz family were back on court as Isla started out with Net Set Go. Each season Nikia was asked about making a comeback and she maintained her negative stance until 2019 when she decided she would once again return to the game she played so well.

Unfortunately Club circumstances meant Nikia found herself in Senior 2 not the Senior 6 or 7 team she thought she signed up for. But she persevered and certainly challenged herself and while the season was tough she was rewarded with another Best and Fairest trophy at the end of the season.

Season 2020 was Covid and Season 2021 found her playing in Senior 3 and again picking up another personal award, 2nd Runner-Up Best and Fairest.

Nikia has certainly demonstrated she is a dedicated and loyal Tanunda Netball Club person. She has enjoyed a long and successful history with the Club, experiencing numerous team awards as well as a myriad of personal awards. The Club looks forward to seeing what else Nikia achieves in her own personal game as well as watching her own children's achievement on the court.

2022 was my first-year coaching Sub Junior 1's and I thoroughly enjoyed coaching this great group of girls. My goals for this season were personal development, skill development and team development.

Personal development

At the beginning of the season, I asked the girls about what they thought their individual strengths and weaknesses were and what they would like to achieve personally this season. I asked them to think about the positions they had played in the past and what positions they wanted to focus on for this season. This laid the foundation for what I hoped to aim for in their development in netball for their future years. At the beginning of each training we reflected on the previous game and where players had grown in their confidence, personal obstacles they had overcome and their performance as a team member (encouragement, support etc), Captaincy for each game was rotated and the player who was captain for the match was encouraged to lead the warmup at training and game day, have input on training drills and activities as well as at break times in the game. My intention was for the girls to get an insight into the captaincy role for future years and opportunities.

Skill Development

We began the season going back to basics. Revisiting foundation skills like passing, creating space, leading and defence down the court. As the season progressed training sessions took on more of a focus on key themes (centre court, goal third, defence etc) which our training drills then focused on. We continuously worked on set plays, fitness, energy conservation, moving to protect our joints, peripheral vision, technique and accuracy, particularly in defence and goal shooting. Skill development was based on the recommended skills to be acquired at this age. Bundy generously worked closely with some of the players, particularly the shooters in the goal circle as this is not my area of expertise.

Team Development

Fortunately, this group of girls have played together for a few years now, however we had two new players, and with the girls attending different schools, it was important the groundwork for teamwork was laid early in the season and continued throughout. Time in trainings was allowed for 'fun' relationship building activities and whilst training finished at 6:30pm, most of the time the girls stayed for another 15 -20mins just to hang out, shoot some goals or play their own games. It was a pleasure to watch the girl's friendships grow and this transferred to the court with an increase in support of each other, motivation, resilience, trusting each other as players as well as respect amongst the players, for me as their coach and other officials.

We were also fortunate to have REFTEC (Matt and Shannon Jones) generously offered to sponsor our team this year, and Matt as team manager organised and sponsored further team building activities including a bowling afternoon, Maccas dinner, Browns donuts and our end of year activity Laser tag and dinner Mawson Lakes Hotel.

This team had another great season and just missed out on playing the grand final. All the girls have shown significant improvement and are ready for the challenge of Juniors next season. I would like to thank the parents for supporting me as a coach and my goals for the team. I appreciate everyone's contribution to scoring and timing and helping out when needed. I would also like to thank Matt Jones who came on as team manager this year who amazing organisation ensured game day went smoothly and I could focus on the girls and the game. Lastly a thankyou to the girls who were such an enthusiastic and respectful group. Well done girls on a great season!
