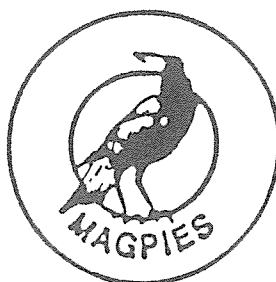

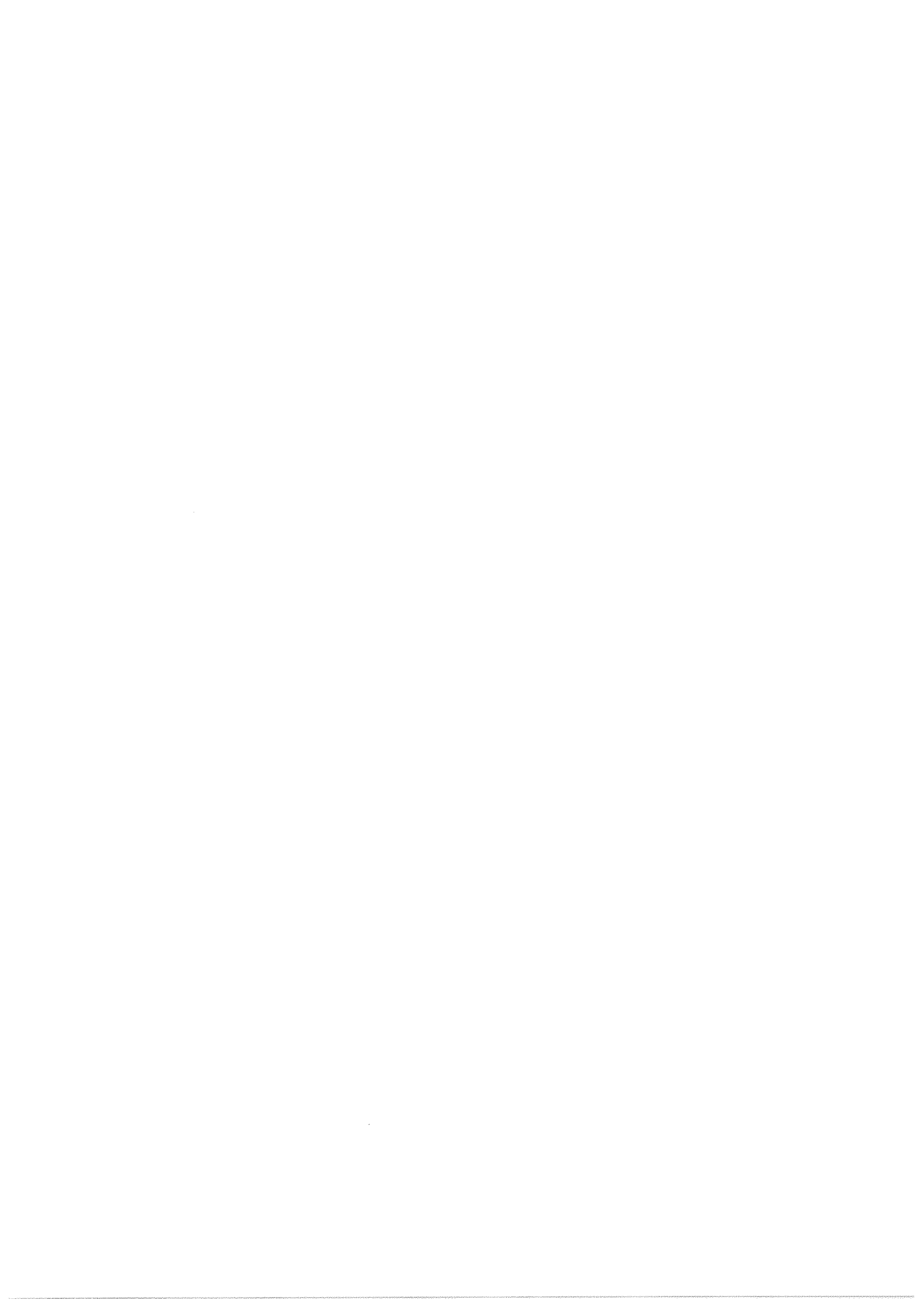
My team was made from girls that all came from modifieds last year. With the new age change being 13 and under nor under 13's this meant the girls were playing against girls that were sometimes two or three years older.

Seventeen girls became part of the squad of the Under 8's which trained for 45 minutes weekly. My brief was to teach the girls some basic skills re catching the ball, passing, some footwork and then a beginner introduction to the game itself. They were an enthusiastic bunch and it amused me as to how readily they would continue on and on, with or without variations on one particular drill.

Once I introduced the concept of a game - something that was pre-empted by the fact that sometimes the Modifieds had to fill a second team, hence the minis filled the extra spots- training took on the look of any junior training in that there was an opportunity for match play. In the early stages it was perhaps difficult to recognise what game it was that they were playing but towards the end of the season it was good to see the growth and skills that had developed.
