The Tanunda Netball Club would like to recognise and award Life Membership to a person who has not only been associated with the Club for 20 Years but has given significant service to the Club – Sue Martin.

Sue began her netball career with the Tanunda Netball Club in 1997. Sue arrived in town with both a young man (that would be and still is Steven) and 3 young girls, Toni, Lauren and Sarah. Sue's playing career began in the Senior 3's in 1997. At the end of the season she was awarded Runner-up Best and Fairest. She continued in Senior 3 in 1998 and that year the team was a Grand Finalist team. In 1999 Sue was selected in the Senior 4 team and in that year, won the Most Consistent Team Player. In 2000 she again made the Senior 4 squad and once again won the Best and Fairest Runner-up award. It looks like Sue had a gap year in 2001 and came back as a player and Coach of the Senior 4's in 2002.

In 2003 Sue graciously made space for younger players and played in the Senior 5 team. The following year she co-coached the Senior 5's with Kirsty Roehr and filled in as a player on a needs basis. 2005 and Sue disappeared off the books. I think this may have been when Sue took Maternity leave to have not one but two babies. It took a couple of years to recover from this major upheaval in her life and Sue didn't return to the playing court until 2007 but still making the Senior 5's and hitting good form, taking out the Best and Fairest Runner-up award.

2008 Sue debut in the Senior 6 squad and won 2nd Runner-up at the end of that season. Sue took a break from playing but came back in 2014 to begin her career in the Senior 7 Team. Recruiting took on a whole new meaning in 2015 and the Dream Team evolved. The team made the Grand Final this year but lost to Willaston in a heat wave at Kapunda. More recruiting for the 2016 season found us some fresh legs and this year the Tanunda 7's took out the Clubs first ever Senior 7 Premiership. 2017 was another strong year and the Dream Team made the Grand Final but went down to Willaston in the dying moments of the game. Sue played her 200th game during the season and also won 2nd Runner-up Trophy at the end of the season. 2018 Sue continued playing in the Dream Team who finished the minor and major rounds as Premiers.

Sue has certainly had a memorable playing career. But her time with the Club also reflects significant service. Sue has dedicated numerous seasons to coaching. In 2001 she coached the Intermediates; in 2002 she was a playing coach of Senior 4 and also coached Modifieds; cocoached Senior 5's in 2004; Sub-Junior 1 coach in 2006; Sub-Junior 2 Coach in 2007; coached Intermediates with Jason Moon in 2008; Junior 1's with Lauren in 2011; Senior 4's in 2012; Sub-Junior 3's in 2015 and finally she coached the Junior 2's to the Grand Final this season.

Sue was on the Junior Committee for four years, 2001 – 2004, she has had several stints on the committee totalling 8 years all up. When she has been on the committee she willingly takes on extra roles. She was proxy Association delegate in 1998, she helped with sponsorship in 2009 and for the last four years has been the Junior Development rep at Association level. She has also filled the role of Team Manager and consistently helps with umpiring. Sue's hard work and commitment was acknowledged in 2008 when she won the Club Person of the Year award.

Sue's involvement in the Club has further been enhanced by being a mum of four girls who have all played for the Club. She has spent many hours on the sideline watching her girls play; supporting them as they themselves became coaches and being a positive role model when it comes to being a loyal Club person. Sue has always been prepared to put in the hard yards and go above and beyond to help others.

Sue is a great team member......always planning the next social event or keeping us connected through social media. She leads by example at training even though it hurts and she certainly loves to win. And she has been prepared to share her skills and time for the benefit of others, both juniors and seniors over time.

Sue is a dedicated Tanunda Netball Club person. She demonstrates quite clearly through action and words that Membership of a Club is not just about playing games but also about giving back.

The Tanunda Netball Club also wish to recognise and award Life Membership to one of our members who has had a 20 year history with our Club – Sonya Day.

Sonya Miegel moved to Tanunda in August 1996 and joined the Tanunda Netball Club in 1997. She was a young gun who played the game of life and netball pretty hard. "Bundy" stuck very early in the piece and it had nothing to do with living in Bundaberg. She caught the eye of the then Senior 2 coach with her combination of skills, humour and team "spirit". The coach liked what she saw and quickly added Bundy to her team list.

But Bundy's career near the top was short lived and in 1998 she played in the Senior 3's with the now legendary Sue Martin. Just as an aside I need to share that since I have coached the Senior 7 Dream Team which both Sue and Bundy have always been a part of, I have felt they have almost a sisterly relationship. Sue being the "older sister" is constantly bossing Bundy about. Bundy can never get it right and is often chastised for her passing. Bundy in return constantly looks up to Sue and respectfully refers to Sue as "Skip". These two girls joined the Club in the same year and in their early years in the Club often played in the same team and now in their latter years they again find themselves playing together. It's interesting to see how their paths are so interwoven and the friendship they share is quite special.

Back to Bundy!

The next 5 seasons saw Bundy playing in Senior 4's. In 2000 Bundy played and coached the 4's. In 2005 and 2006 she played Senior 5's, winning the Best and Fairest award in 2006. Bundy was promoted in 2007 back to Senior 4 team and once again found herself with another personal award, winning Best and Fairest Runner-Up. In 2009 she played in Senior 5.

Umpiring goes hand in hand with playing netball. All players are expected to help in some way. Throughout her time at the Tanunda Netball Club Bundy has always volunteered as an umpire. She obviously was pretty good at it as she was awarded her "C" Grade Badge in 2003. So this became a key focus for her, readily taking on the looks and glares of the Senior players. In 2009 she was awarded the "Marjorie Lehmann Memorial Trophy". This was a new Club award and aimed to recognise an umpire each season who displayed an exemplary attitude and commitment to umpiring. What a great honour to win such an award and it certainly encouraged Bundy to further her netball career through umpiring.

Since 2010 she has held the position of Umpire's Co-ordinator for all but two years when I think she may have had some Maternity Leave. This usually means umpiring a minimum of two games each week as well as putting together a roster of umpires to cover up to 18 games each week. That is a lot of grovelling, phone calls and texts!!

Other achievements include being awarded 150 Games in 2015 and this year Round 5 at Kapunda her 200th game, being selected in the Dream Team in 2015 and playing in two premierships in 2016 and 2018.

Bundy is a great team player both on the court and within the Club. She is a quiet achiever, going about her game and duties with a steely determination. She doesn't look for accolades but her commitment and dedication is second to none.

There were three players from the 2017 Senior 4 team that were reselected for the 2018 season. The girls formed a very quick connection with each other. The season started strong and the girls played well over the first few games, combining well as a new group of players. It was apparent that their oncourt support for each other made them a genuine contender for a finals birth. Part way through the minor round one of our strong defenders had the wonderful news that she was pregnant and left just prior to the end of the minor round.

The team demographics made it difficult for regular full attendance trainings throughout the year, due to family commitments and shift work. Rather than put un necessary pressure on an aspect of life that is for recreation and relaxation, a benchmark was set early in the season by the coach that training would be attended where possible but not at the expense of stress due to work or family commitments.

The girls had some memorable moments on court, particularly with their games against Gawler Centrals and Willaston in the first round. The girls played like a championship side, showing their full potential as a team. Significant investment was made by both coaches to up skill the girls with position knowledge and general court play. The girls were extremely receptive and several showed marked improvements with their position knowledge.

From a Coaches perspective, it was a pleasure to coach such a happy, supportive, talented and respectful group who individually and together were as good as any team in Div 4. The final Leaders board did not reflect the potential of the team, nor did it reflect the amount of satisfaction the girls gained from every game.
