TANUNDA NETBALL CLUB LIFE MEMBERSHIP PRESENTED TO DI BARTSCH Saturday, 24th September, 2011

It is with great pleasure we award the highest honour in any Club – that of Life Membership – to Di Bartsch.

Di, or Dianne Schmidt should we say, began her career with the Tanunda Netball Club in 1979. Junior subs were a mere \$2.50, A Grade subs were \$6.00, black and white tracksuits became part of the registered uniform and trophies cost \$6.00. The netball courts were still over by the current bowling greens and porta flood lights were used to light Court 2. The major fundraiser for the year was the Barn Dance!!

In 1979 Dianne played in "G" Grade and was awarded the Best and Fairest trophy that season. Dianne continued to play juniors until 1984. In 1980 "G' and "H" Grade became known as Sub-Juniors and "E" and "F" Grade became Juniors. Dianne was to win another Best and Fairest Award in 1982 as a Junior 1 player.

Between 1984 and 1994, Dianne entered the realms of senior netball. In 1984 she played Division 4 and won the Most Improved Trophy that season. She also became a Sub-Junior "Helper", assisting with coaching the little tackers. In 1986 she became the umpire's selector and in 1987 she joined the committee for the first time. In 1987 she also became a fully fledged coach in her right, coaching the Sub-Junior 3's to a premiership.

In 1995 Di, I'm sure she was called Di by now, played Senior 2's and in 1996 was a playing Coach of the Senior 3 side as well as coaching Senior 4's. She won the Best and Fairest Runner-up trophy that season. After a break in 1997, Di came back to play Senior 6 in 1998. Peter Hueppauff was the coach and that year the Senior 6's took out the premiership by 4 goals. Di won Best and Fairest Runner-up, was awarded Best on Court Grand Final Day and was also the Association Best and Fairest Runner-up.

The following year Di was selected to play Senior 3 under coach Tony Gepp. This was another premiership season. In 2000 Di found herself back in the Senior 2 side. The next five years Di was a regular in the Senior 3 side. She won Best and Fairest Runner-up in 2002, Best and Fairest in 2003 and again Best and Fairest Runner-up in 2004.

In 2006 Di played Senior 4's and again won the Best and Fairest award for that team. Her coach said Di "had commitment on a training night and on a Saturday." In 2007 she was a playing coach of the Senior 4's. 2008 until the present Di has played Senior 5 and in 2010 again won another award of Best and Fairest Runner-up.

Di had a three year stint on committee from 2001 to 2003 and, given her background in banking, took on the role of Treasurer during this time. She also coached the "Mini's in 2005 and 2006 and has always been prepared to pick-up a whistle and umpire.

Being a member of a club over a period of 33 years is an achievement in itself. It is an achievement to have such longevity as a player in a Club and to consistently win awards in one's team is a true indication of a player with skills and commitment to the game.

Dianne, Di, Schmiddie.......I can vaguely remember your early days in the Club, those long legs, pig tails and glasses. You traded the glasses for contacts, pig tails for a pony, Schmidt for Bartsch but you still have those long legs.

The Tanunda Netball Club would like to recognize and reward your long term association with our Club, your ongoing service and enthusiasm to the Club. You are truly worthy of the ultimate club award – Life Membership.

TANUNDA NETBALL CLUB LIFE MEMBERSHIP PRESENTED TO KAREN FOX Saturday, 24th September, 2011

Two times in the history of our Club has the committee chosen to award two Life Memberships in the same year. In 1970 Edna Behrndt and Kay Hueppauff were awarded the very first Life Membership's from the Tanunda Netball Club. Then in 1987, Sue Fuller and Lynne Lindner were rewarded for their time and commitment to our Club.

Obviously we are about to create history again tonight by awarding a second Life Membership. It is with great pleasure we award the highest honour in any Club – that of Life Membership – to Karen Fox.

Karen's first year at the Tanunda Netball Club was 1989 and it was an absolute boomer. She was selected in the "A" Grade, playing alongside netball greats Marianne Kieboom, Robyn Horley, Celia Fielke, Gayle Dawkins, Kristen Falkenberg and of course Jo Buck. And in her first year in the Club shared in a very special premiership.

Karen decided she would finish on a high note and seemingly as soon as the final champagne was drunk celebrating that milestone she fell pregnant. Karen didn't hit the court again until 1994 where she was the playing coach of the Senior 2 side. Another break ensued due to another baby (I told her to stop at two!) After 3 children and promising she wouldn't fall pregnant again, she recommenced her playing career in earnest in 1998 once again playing Senior 2.

She won her second premiership in 2000 as a member of a highly skilled and "hungry" Senior 3 Team. In 2001 she once again was selected to play in the Senior 2 side, was Captain and won the Best and Fairest Award. Her coach that year said "She played really well, captained the team brilliantly, always made good constructive suggestions and gave me great support". Thanks Kieran for putting those thoughts in your annual report that year!!

Karen continued to play Senior 2's until 2006. She again filled the role of a playing coach in 2004 and Captain in 2005. The next three years she played Senior 3. Notably in 2008 she played alongside of Ashleigh...it's been a while since we've seen a mother/daughter combo in the same team. She also won Best and Fairest Runner-up in that year. In 2009 she was again a playing coach. In 2010 she played Senior 4 and this year she played Senior 5. What can I say...she has played netball at the highest level and has almost played at the lowest.

Karen has taken on various service roles within the Club over the years. One of the most valuable roles she has taken on time and time again is the role of coach. While she played several years as a playing coach, she also took on the role of coach during those "baby" years, Senior 4 in 1990 and Senior 2 in 1994. In 1999, when Ashleigh began her illustrious career Karen became the Modified Coach. She coached Moddies again in 2000, 11 and Unders in 2001...the team won every game except for the first and finished top of the premiership table. In 2004 she coached Junior 2, 2005 Sub-Junior 2's and in the last two years has again taken on a very important coaching role in the Sub-Junior division.

Karen has also been a very "live" committee person. She has spent 12 years on the committee including 4 years as President, 2002 – 2005, She has demonstrated a passion for the Junior Committee and also Fundraising. She was responsible for introducing the concept of putting a cow on the oval and encouraging a crowd of people to watch and wait for "the Moo to Poo"!! She was also passionate about lamington drives. To complete the package she readily picks up the whistle and umpires on a regular basis.

Being a member of a club for 23 years is an achievement in itself – to be so fully immersed in the club – as a player, Captain, parent, coach, committee member, President, Proxy Association Delegate, Social Committee member, Fundraising Committee, Junior Committee and umpire is an amazing achievement. Her enthusiasm, dedication and service to the Tanunda Netball Club since 1989 has been tireless – her commitment outstanding.

The Tanunda Netball Club is indeed grateful for such ongoing service and enthusiasm to the Club. You are truly worthy of this ultimate club award – Life Membership.

President's Report

I have to say that this would have to have been the coldest and wettest netball season I have been a part of, but the weather certainly did not deter the netball spirit of our club.

We had most of our coaches appointed and ready to go prior to registration night and this allowed the club to make team selections early on enabling them to begin skill and fitness training earlier than last year. That said, there were still a couple of hiccups early on in relation to senior and junior selections, but the committee is already working towards systems to overcome this again in following seasons.

Our coaches were extremely committed and performed exceptionally well in all grades. It was certainly a harmonious season with very few problems for the committee to assist with. It is especially satisfying for me to know that many of our current coaches are keen to return to their roles for 2012. The mentoring of younger coaches is certainly working in our favour and will be a huge asset to the club in years to come. I would like to encourage our younger co-coaches to perhaps consider coaching their own teams in 2012, but to continue to work together.

We had a new fundraising event this season with the Indian Curry night held in the football clubrooms. This was an idea presented to the club by Howard Duncan. Howard organised the night, worked hard as master chef on the night and donated all profits to the club. Thank you to Howard, Anne-Marie and your support crew for your efforts. The food was amazing, attendance was excellent and I know many will participate in this event in coming years. The funds raised will certainly help our club continue its growth.

Court 3 has been identified as a major problem which possibly takes from the terrible playing conditions court 1 and 2 both offered this year. Given this was a particularly cold and wet season; the uneven playing surface was often moist creating an extremely slippery surface and at times, hazardous playing environment. There were a number of injuries on court 3 this year, but we cannot determine whether this was related to the surface or unfortunate circumstance. Our committee is continually liaising with the Tanunda Parks Committee, The Barossa Council and the Tanunda Tennis Club to improve this as soon as possible.

Congratulations to our players selected in representative sides this season and to those who were successful enough to have been recognised for their talent at association presentations. At club level, we had 6 teams make it to the finals, all finishing 4th. Some teams could've advanced further if not for such a close loss on the day, and others could've been there had it not been for a close loss in the minor round. Either way, premierships (the highest success) is not out of reach for many of our teams now.

Congratulations to Karen Fox and Dianne Bartsch for the recognition of their contribution to our club over the years. Life membership is an honour you both earned and deserve and you join a very elite group of ladies with this award.

I've had a lot of fun working with the committee, coaching, umpiring, watching the game we love and building friendships with players and supporters (and even the opposition) over the last two years. I would like to thank everyone for their contribution to our club and personal support, loyalty and friendship received during my time as president. While I cannot be involved in an official capacity next season, I am very excited about what 2012 brings and will certainly be a part of it.

Things got off to a poor start when the coaches up the line took so long to pick their teams that the 5's and 6's had hardly any time to practice as teams before the games started. The 5's only had one training session before their first game and we had three, because Barossa didn't have a senior 6 team, and then the Club had a bye.

Given so little time, there was no chance to develop any cohesion or teamwork or do any game systems or planning. Consequently, I took the unorthodox step of forgoing the fitness work and concentrating on ball skills, and while that did help our lack of fitness may have told in some of our results later in the season.

Early in the season we lost Jodie Parker due to injury and Lydia Kalleske due to pregnancy and even though we were fortunate to pick up Meagan Mowbray and Sally McCarthy as replacements, we did have to contend with a lot of sickness and injury throughout the season.

In 2010 this team won 3 and drew 1, and this season despite scoring 129 goals more, we only won three games. The grade this year was a fair bit stronger, especially when it came to shooting. Willaston neat us by 32 in the first round and we made so many passing errors that they had 37 more shots. In the second round they beat us by 19 but they only had 4 more shots. Trouble was their shooter scored 49 goals at 96%, not bad for a senior 6!

We improved a lot during the season and in the second round we would be close to, or in front of the top teams for half a game, but we couldn't sustain our performance for four quarters.

Overall I was disappointed with the season and I have to take my share of the blame. Looking at what the team did last season, I thought if I could fix their passing and positioning, everything would fall into place, but as is often the case things were a lot different from the inside.

Having coached mainly senior 1's and 2's, and then not coaching for a few years, I think I came back a bit rusty. What surprised me was the player's lack of hurt when they made an error, the speed with which they lost their confidence during games, and how low they set their goals, both in their personal performance and in their finals aspirations. It took me too long to work out how to get the best out of each individual player, and my communication with the team wasn't as good as it should have been.

As for the players, they need to be more urgent in their efforts to improve. They need to set their sights higher, and be prepared to accept criticism when it's justified. They need to realize that if they work hard they have a good chance to play finals and even be a premiership contender.

Congratulations to our trophy winners, Meagan Mowbray, Sally McCarthy and Kirsty Moore. Along with Kirsty McCulloch who just missed out, they were our most consistent players and their trophies were well deserved.

Thanks to the committee for their work, and the umpires for theirs. Thanks to the players and our helpers, especially Jodie and Lydia. Thanks to Sonia and the senior 5's, it's been a joy to work with them; they're a team of high class women with abominable taste in music. I'd love to do it again next season. Bring on 2012 – I can smell finals in the air.

We were fortunate enough to welcome two new players to the team (Ashlyn and Chantelle) who proved to be invaluable assets to the team. The constant rotations that I employed aimed to extend the girls' knowledge and skills of different positions whilst ensuring that they all had access to equal game time each week. I was pleased with the way the girls responded to these rotations as many became used to playing a range of positions with ease in a short period of time. Sometimes though, the constant changes did affect the rhythm of their game, but I was determined to allow the team to play under the Netta rules which clearly states that all girls must experience different positions as regularly as possible.

We unfortunately had to say goodbye to Ashlyn early in the first round due to her family moving away from the Barossa. It was so sad to see her leave as her energy, drive and tenacious spirit would be missed by our team. We bounced back with a number of successful games in a row due to the girls' ability to play more defensively and move the ball more quickly down the court, whilst goal conversions increased dramatically too.

I believe that the girls improved tremendously as the season progressed into the second round due to a number of important factors. Firstly, they became more focused at training and really started to engage with the drills whilst learning to remember the fundamental rules of the game. Secondly, stepping, holding the ball, playing your own and throwing the ball in the wrong direction were almost non-existent as the girls' were learning to concentrate on sticking with their players using a strong defensive game plan. Thirdly, they also started to throw the ball more quickly to each other, yet this area was still one we needed to address as sometimes the ball was not thrown accurately or they failed to get in front with their leading. Lastly, the girls' responded positively to my mantra of being "Thinking netballers", a saying that I would constantly reinforce with the team to ensure that they were on the court, playing their positions and thinking about their game. I wanted them to learn to play as a team; to play their positions without following the ball around the court as individuals in order to be successful.

I believe that we achieved enormous success both on and off the court this year. The girls respected me, as well as each other and hence you could see the team spirit erupting on the court each week, regardless of the positions they were asked to play or the strength of the opposition. Each week, they walked onto the court with a positive, enthusiastic attitude that allowed them to work effectively as a team. They proved to be tough, strong, fair competitors who strived to get the ball towards their goal end and who were still able to smile at the end of every game regardless of the outcome.
