All the girls in this team were keen to play in a variety of positions. This flexibility enabled me to give equal court time to all players yet still retain a combination on court that was effective.

Thanks to our captain Alex Miller who took on the responsibility of warming up her team mates at training and prior to each game. It certainly makes the coach's role much easier when the captain is as dedicated as Alex is. I was also particularly pleased with the enthusiasm of all players both at training and on match days. The girls were punctual, reliable and always willing to help set up the courts as well as eager to warm up well in advance of the match.

We won many games this year but were a win short of making the finals. There were a couple of games that we lost early in the season that we perhaps could have won which would have put us in to the final four. However, our grand achievement this year was being the only team to beat the eventual premiers of this grade, Nuriootpa, in an extremely close and exciting game in the second round.

Our season began with an enthusiastic group of ten girls who were eager to learn the basic skills of netball. The girls' skill level and experience with the game of netball varied; some had never played before, whilst many had participated in the Net Set Go programme from last year, with only one player having already played a full year of Netta 2 in 2009. Despite these differences, the girls were keen to extend their skills as a team during practices and these sessions became crucial for their continued development. The emphasis for each session was to promote the basic skills of netball whilst having fun at the same time. It was important to initiate this approach right from the start so that the girls valued their level of participation in the game without focusing on the goals being scored. Netta 2's modified rules promote an appreciation for the game without the need for recording the goals. I was very determined to ensure that my team would enjoy the journey each week and adopt a positive attitude towards the game of netball whilst instilling a sense of fun amongst the team. We were fortunate enough to have the Netta 1 girls to train with, under the competent coaching of Karen Underwood. During these early training sessions, we focused on basic netball skills including how to throw the ball, the importance of using the correct foot skills, the difference between attacking and defending and how to throw goals. Within this time, I also adopted netball drills that would help them to understand the rules of netball. Each training session was divided into specific sections to ensure that the girls remained engaged, with the emphasis on 100% participation. The initial warm ups involved light jogging/walking followed by dynamic stretches, a fun running game, basic skills drills and then a practice game. The girls quickly adjusted to the training routine and set about undertaking each section with determination and commitment.

Our early experiences on the netball court were overwhelming, nerve wrecking yet very encouraging. I believe the girls really enjoyed wearing the official Tanunda uniform and they wore it with a sense of pride. This helped them to become familiar with the rituals of netball on game days. With parents and friends on the side lines, the stage was set for a promising season of netball, filled with anticipation and fun!

The sudden change from training to the real game was challenging but they all remained focused and endeavored to listen to my instructions, despite the consistent rotations that I adopted. With ten players, I made sure that everyone had equal court time and was given experience in a different position each week. I was very mindful of the Netta 2 philosophy of changing players at every break, yet my early rotation system proved to be a little too confusing for the girls as they were still learning the positions and became disorientated if they were moved. I learnt to adjust my rotations by trying to keep the girls in either attacking or defending positions for the duration of the game. This proved to be more successful as the weeks progressed and as the girls became more proficient at their positions. As the season progressed, their understanding of the rules improved, allowing them to work more effectively as a team on the court. They also learnt to extend their basic netball skills, especially their accuracy in ball throwing, their ability to defend their opposition and their attacking skills in moving the ball down the court, due to the repetition of drills and the participation in games against the Netta 1's during training. I was very impressed with the girls' ability to accept constructive advice and their willingness to take on any new position that I gave them throughout the year.

Whilst goals evaded us for a large part of the season, no one would have known at the end of each game, given the smiles and accolades from the girls, their parents and myself. My aim was to ensure that the girls felt positive about being part of an inclusive team who valued every player for their contributions on the day and I believe that we succeeded in achieving this.

Our last five games were very exciting with the girls finally showing some real potential in the goal ring, along with a strong defensive game to reinforce their strength across the court. Their attacking positions down the court became stronger but it is still an area that needs to be developed for next year. The following poignant comment from the girls epitomised the season that we had, 'It doesn't matter how many goals we scored, as long as we had fun playing the game!!'

I must sincerely thank the fantastic group of parents who came out each week in mostly pleasant weather conditions to help with timing, first aid, setting up the court and generally to support the team. Finally, I must thank and congratulate the wonderful group of girls for their positive, energetic approach to the season. It has certainly been a productive year; one that I have thoroughly enjoyed and will always remember.
