#### LIFE MEMBERSHIP AWARDED TO LYN HOKLAS

In any sporting club the highest honour that can be given to a person is life membership. Tonight we honour one of our members who has given many years of service and commitment as a player, committee member, coach and umpire to the Tanunda Netball Club. She will become the eleventh person in the fifty five year history of this club to receive this award.

#### Congratulations Lyn Hoklas

Lyn began her netball career with the Williamstown Netball Club where she played all her junior netball. We were fortunate she married a Tanunda resident (namely Brian Hoklas) and this is where her involvement with the Tanunda Netball Club began.

Lyn's playing career with Tanunda commenced in 1985 in the Senior 5 side where she was fortunate enough to win a premiership in her first season plus take out the Best and Fairest and the Hentschke trophy for the most club votes. From here Lyn continued to play through the ranks establishing herself as a reliable and consistent defender. She was an important part of the successful Senior 1 side through the late 1980's and 1990's. She played in three Senior 1 Premierships in 1990, 1994 and 1996 and was runner-up in Senior 1 Best and Fairest in 1997 and 1998. Other premierships for Lyn included the 2000 Senior 3 premiership with the "dream team" and in 2005 with Senior 4.

As a player Lyn has always been committed to working hard as an individual rarely missing a training and putting in 100% effort on the court. This commitment has seen Lyn take out many other club awards plus the Association Best and Fairest for Senior 5 in 2003 and Senior 4 in 2004.

Lyn's first role of coach was to commence in 1994 with the under 17's. This team was the first of many. She has also coached -

Senior 6's - 1995 Under 17's - 1995 Mini's - 1997 Modifieds - 1997,1998 and 2003 Sub junior 3 - 1999 and 2000 Junior 2 - 2003 Junior 1 - 2001 and 2004 Senior 4 - 2004 Senior 5 - 2005

There has also been a long involvement with the Tanunda Netball Club Committee over the years. Lyn first went on the committee in 1994 and also took charge of the netball canteen for that season. She continued as a committee member in 1995 and then took on the role of Club President in 1996 and 1997. After a couple of years break Lyn returned to the committee in 1999 and has been a valuable member since.

Lyn has also served on the junior committee at Tanunda and has been the club representative on the Barossa, Light and Gawler junior development committee for a number of years. As well as all of this she has always found time to help out with umpiring on Saturdays

Lyn has been an active member of our club for over 20 years. She has earned the respect of players she has played with and coached over those years. Congratulations Lyn on your life membership!! It is thoroughly deserved and we look forward to your continued association with the Tanunda Netball Club.
