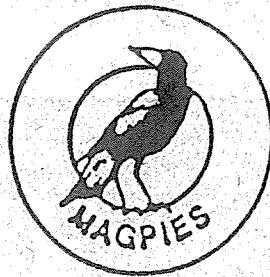

LIFE MEMBERSHIP AWARDED TO JO BUCK

Life membership is only awarded to those who have given service and commitment to this Club over a significant period of time.

Tonight we honor one more of our members with life membership – she will become the ninth person in the history of our Club to receive such an award and a very worthy recipient.

Being a Tanunda Girl the obvious choice to play with the best Club in the Barossa – Tanunda and a great choice it was for herself and the Tanunda Netball Club.

Her association with Tanunda was as a player in 1969 when she was "younger". Her natural ability in netball saw her progress from playing E-Grade in 1976 to C-Grade in 1978 winning the trophy for most consistent player and again in 1979 for B-Grade.

The next step was obviously A-Grade and played in the 1981 premiership team, winning that premiership gave her the incentive to continue with the A-Grade team and was named A-Grade Best & Fairest in 1982.

Getting into the rhythm of the commitment and "training" of A-Grade netball she was a player and captain of the 1983 and 1984 premiership teams again in 1989 and with some "inside" assistance to win the 1990 premiership.

Her first role of coach was to commence in 1989 with the junior 1's and in three consecutive seasons coached premiership sides – 1990 U17's, 1991 Sub Junior 3's and 1992 Senior 3's, certainly a great achievement, and again in 1996 with the Senior 2's – of course her job was made easy that year by having players in her team like Lyn Hoklas, Kristen Falkenberg, Gayle Dawkins, Amy Rohrlach just to name a few.

She also coached:

- senior 2's - 1995 & 1996
- senior 1 & 2's - 1997
- senior 1's - 1998
- mini's - 1999
- junior 2's - 2000

1999 & 2000 she was a player in the Barossa & Light rep masters team

She has won several Club awards –

- 1978 & 1979 C-Grade Most consistent
- 1982 A-Grade best & fairest
- 1998 B-Grade best & fairest runner-up

Her only blemish was to leave the Barossa in 1985 and 1986 but the Barossa was too good to stay away from and soon returned to her origins of the magpies.

Whilst being a wife, mother, player and coach for Tanunda she undertook the extra role of President of the Tanunda Netball Club in 1990 and 1991 and Vice-President in 1995 1996. Then President of the Barossa & Light Netball Association in 1996 & 1997 – what a memorable time that was, the first time in memory that a tribunal was called, there was no guide lines or rules as to conduct such an event but she solved the problem by making sure there were guidelines in place for the next time – which to date hasn't been tested.

You have always been a Club person in the true sense and along with the support of your family you have earned the respect of players you have coached and played with over the many years.

Life membership is an acknowledgement of your service to the Tanunda Netball Club and is given with great respect for all you have done. We look forward to your continued association with the Tanunda Netball Club for years to come.

Hindsight is a powerful thing! Looking back over this season if I was to do it all again.... I wouldn't! Don't get me wrong, I loved working with the girls, I had and I valued the support given by their parents and I enjoyed coaching again. I must admit though that I didn't enjoy playing in isolation each Tuesday night – no other teams about, no extra girls to draw on and always having to set up and pack away everything each week.

So why wouldn't I do it all again? Two main reasons surface – initially I started with a squad of eight which halfway through the season reduced to seven, training became an issue. There was a lack of commitment to training and I couldn't enforce the "no train no play" mentality. I had no option but to play all seven girls each week no matter who turned up to training. Without consistent training we were unable to grow and develop to our full potential. The second reason – what ensued after initial selections, was the two junior 2 sides trained together. That was "nice" but all the other junior 2 sides in the association were training against the junior 1 sides each week, gathering strength and momentum. Tanunda's junior 2's stagnated. We didn't grow at the same rate as our opposition and that was highly evident in the second round results. Our two teams finished fifth and sixth, knowing we lost to the eventual premiers by one goal late in the season highlights my overall disappointment.

If we were to do it all again I would recommend we looked even more closely at the numbers and create large squads. There would be some neutral attrition, and yes it is difficult to rotate large squads but we would be able to develop a training program that would be able to be run despite one or two not fronting each week. We could instill in our girls the concept of commitment and need to be aware of some of the problems that do arise because the Club tries to keep people, especially parents, happy. But in supposedly keeping everyone happy we may not be doing ourselves any favors.

To the team - your parents – thank you for the friendship and all the effort you all put in. Thanks for sharing hot coffees, chocolate biscuits and Macca's, I couldn't have asked for a more supportive group of parents. Thanks for supporting and encouraging your girls in such a valuable manner. Thanks also to the umpires who came out mid-week and made a special effort. To my trophy winners, Marella, Alex and Zana congratulations.

So another season finished. In the end my main regret is that we didn't fulfill my girl's wishes, which was simply to play on a Saturday. Here's to 2001 !
