### Senior 1 - Celia Johnson

It's a good time to be writing this report. We're still on a high after last weekend.

At the start of the season, I wasn't sure if I wanted to take on the responsibility of coaching and playing. I knew that I couldn't do it alone- and so I was undecided. I cast my mind back to last season, 2 years ago, to playing under Neil Tarca- and how much I enjoyed the season. I felt that we had worked well together as captain/coach and so I was keen to get Neil involved again this year.

I thought the combination worked well.

Neil and I felt pretty confident at the start. The girls were keen and motivated. Neil had designed some vigourous fitness demands and home routines and we set our team goals, we wanted the big one.

Initially I wanted to just get to the finals fullstop, but Neil's vision and goals infected us all.

It was a great start to the season.

The girls gave 100% and all eight players were in form. We were lucky to have such a versatile team. We seemed in tune with each other. I was worried pre-season that the girls would find it strange listening to what I had to say- and I thought how could I demand things of them?- what if I can't perform myself?. So there was a bit of pressure there. That is where having someone like Neil working with you so closely was great. She calls a spade a spade- and there's no mistake about that. She also taught me alot about coaching adults. Being a school teacher, I was used to being more directional and autocratic! I soon learnt that adult players have very delicate egos and there is a certain way to approach things. It's so important to keep team moral up and the players focused in.

By the end of the season, I was feeling tired and drained and ready for it all to end!. To their credit, the team was so responsive and helpful, I couldn't have asked for a more supportive team. They did all we asked at trainings and more.

The lines of communication were always open and at no time did any little dissatisfaction fester.

Losing the 2nd semi- final was a Godsend, I think, we played badly and if we'd won-we would have been thrashed in the grand final. We would have come out as complacement as Kapunda did.

Beating Centrals in the preliminary final gave us our confidence, and gave us a week to get in gear and get our minds back on the task. Saturday the 17th was one of the highlights of my netball career. I won't forget that game in a hurry.

The Senior 1 girls deserved that premiership after a full season of hard work.

I'd also like to thank the committee in their support and listening to any queries. I admit early on I felt a bit lost as to expectations and running of things, but people like Cheryl and Jo were very helpful and accepting.

### Senior 1 cont. - Neil Tarca

When Celia approached me to help her coach the Sen 1 side, I first had some minor hesitations. I had already committed myself to the Barossa and Light Netball Association as Country Carnival Co ordinator, knowing the big task ahead and even though I was keen to work with Celia, I felt that unless I could give and receive a 100% commitment from a team, I would not be happy. However, I had just completed my State level 2 and was ready to burst, loaded with experience and valuable information and Celia and I had the same goals, dreams and line of thinking.......YES!

I set home training programmes and fitness testings. I wanted each player to earn their spot and work hard to achieve this. Next and most importantly was setting our team goal. Making the final 4 and team cohesion. Celia and I selected a versatile team of 8, allowing for injuries, holidays and sickness.

Making our decision, we kept the team informed and always encouraged feedback. For the first 2 to 3 weeks into trainings, I noticed Celia was concentrating more on the smooth running of things and and this was preventing her from reaching her full potential as a player. After speaking with Celia, I stepped in, set training programmes and ran them, with Celia leading the way. Gruelling sprints, sit-ups, pushups, drills, some repetitive, until correct. This is where Celia gained respect of her players and her natural leadership qualities grew week by week.

It was then that I knew this team was committed.

Our introduction to the competitive round was sharp, fit and strong and we had to prove this, Wins!

On some occasions we only had 7 players and this gave us the perfect opportunity to play, train and reserve our up and coming under 15s.

Unfortunately due to personal reasons, I was unable to coach for 3 weeks. To top this off it was at, what I considered the most important time in our season. After a settling in period early in the season, both teams began working well and success followed. We were winning more games than we were losing, some excellent combinations of players were emerging, very noticeably in the defensive circle where experience and youth were blending brilliantly, and the commitment of all squad members to practice and to each other was pleasing. As the weeks passed by we identified a flaw in our match play, our failure to move the ball freely into our own goal and the teams spent practice time working on this aspect. Some improvement was evident and the new tactics appeared to be successful although it was an area of our game about which I always felt anxious.
