I soon learnt that adult players have very delicate egos and there is a certain way to approach things. It's so important to keep team moral up and the players focused in.

By the end of the season, I was feeling tired and drained and ready for it all to end!. To their credit, the team was so responsive and helpful, I couldn't have asked for a more supportive team. They did all we asked at trainings and more.

I set home training programmes and fitness testings. I wanted each player to earn their spot and work hard to achieve this. Next and most importantly was setting our team goal. 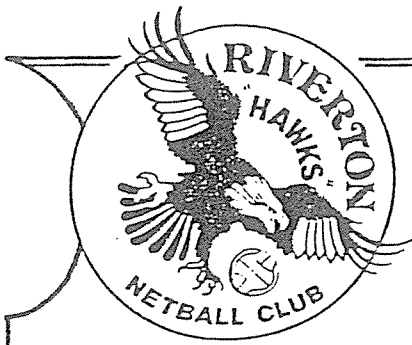
