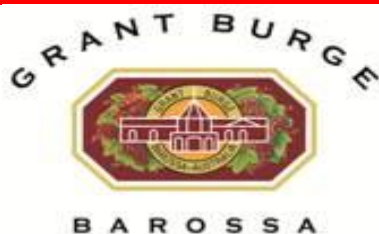

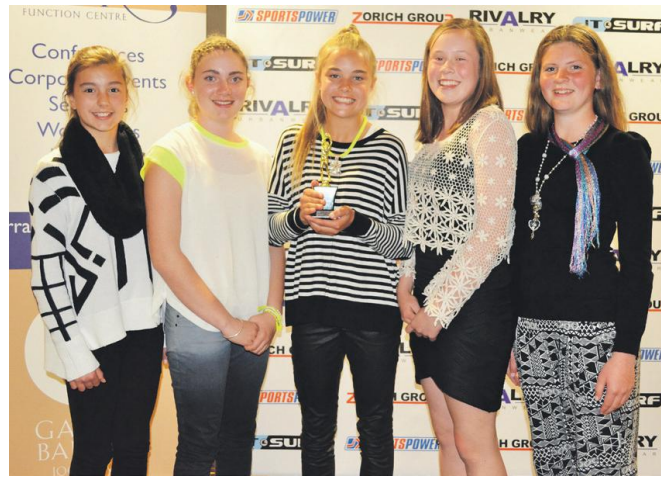

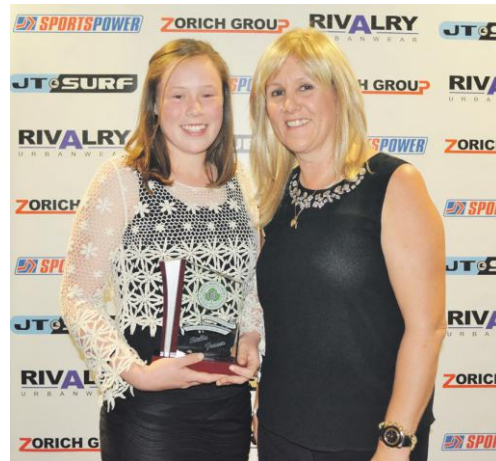

LIFE MEMBERSHIP PRESENTED TO
Gabrielle Marschall
Saturday, 26th September, 2014

History within a Club is a very special thing and to be part of a Club for any length of time is indeed a most unique. Tonight we recognise one of our members who has had a 30 year history with our Club and to me, she is still one of our young guns.

It is with great pleasure we award the highest honour in any Club – that of Life Membership – to Gabrielle Marschall.

Gabrielle began her netball career in 1984 as a modified player.....or in those days she was an “unofficial” player. From here she steadily made her way up the ranks as an official player, playing 3 years in sub-juniors and 2 years in Juniors. 1990 was a highlight year for Gabrielle as she was a member of the Intermediate 1 Premiership side who easily won their Grand Final against Riverton, 50 – 28. I could say it was due to the excellent coaching she received that year but there a few of us in the room who enjoyed coaching this young player.

Gabrielle joined the senior players rank in 1992 playing in Senior 4. By 1997 she moved in the Senior 3 side and then had a 5 year run in the Senior 2 side beginning in 1999. In 2004 Gabrielle was selected in the Senior 1 side and played in the Senior 1 side 4 years out of the next 5. In more recent times she has played in the Senior 3 team, including this year. Little wonder she played her 350th game this year.

As a player she has also received numerous awards...1992 Senior 4 Best and Fairest Runner-up, 1996 Senior 4 Best and Fairest, Senior 2 Runner-up Best and Fairest in both 1999 and 2000, 2004 Senior 1 Most Consistent Player, 2009 Senior 2 2nd Runner-up Best and Fairest and again in 2014 Senior 3 2nd Runner-up Best and Fairest.

In the last 10 years Gabrielle has also shown her Club spirit and has taken on various service roles within the Club. In 2006 she took on the role of Vice President, a role she maintained for 3 years. She continued on as a committee person in 2009 and 2010 and was the Club’s Association Delegate for four years. She even tried her hand at coaching juniors.

But following in her mother’s footsteps, and no doubt encouraged and trained by that same mother, Gabrielle has taken up that valuable role of umpiring. While she has regularly umpired over the years she has been a more regular senior umpire in more recent times and received the Marjorie Lehmann Memorial Trophy Umpires Award in 2011 – a true honour and one that acknowledged her commitment to the role.

Being a member of a club for 30 years is an achievement in itself – to be so fully immersed in the club – as a player, Vice-Captain, coach, committee member, Vice- President, Association Delegate and umpire is an amazing achievement. To achieve 350 games and still be playing 30 years on from the beginning is also an amazing fete.

Gabrielle’s enthusiasm, dedication and service to the Tanunda Netball Club since 1984 is quite remarkable and her commitment outstanding. To many she has always been a quiet achiever.

The Tanunda Netball Club is indeed grateful for such ongoing service and loyalty to the Club. You are truly worthy of this ultimate club award – Life Membership.

Everyone must be willing to give 100% towards the 2015 season if we are seriously going to push for a premierships season. It can be done with a total commitment to the task.

Our younger players will continue to mature and grow in confidence and our senior players will continue to mentor the youth and strive for success. There is light in the tunnel and I think everyone can see it.

Success is something that has to be worked hard for and isn't handed out on a plate. Having high attendance rates at training, being team and club orientated and having a burning, united desire to achieve the ultimate reward must all be key components in 2015. Team spirit, solidarity and belief in each other with a willingness to give as much as you can for the club will see us a long way down the road to getting that reward.

It is likely that there may be some player movements again leading into 2015. In saying that, the core group will stay together and continue to build on the foundations that have been put in place for a successful season ahead.

There are plenty of people who work tirelessly to run the TNC and they deserve to see the club achieve success just as much as the players. I would like to thank the senior two coach, Jeanette Hooper, Toby Mifflin, Serena Linton and Rob as club trainer, Melissa Smith as team manager and primary carer, the committee and all our sponsors.
