### **President's Report**

A lot of work had gone into the preparation for the 2021 season, given that COVID19 pandemic was still prevalent in the world. It was pleasing to see so many players, particularly in the senior grades, for the upcoming season. I am proud to see the support for each other to overcome adversity and to build resilience during these unprecedented times.

The Club filled teams from Senior 1 to Senior 6 – which was great given that in the 2019 season we only had 4 senior teams. We had two Intermediate teams, two Junior teams, three Sub Junior teams, two Primary teams and two Go (formerly Netta) teams. It was a BLGNA decision to reduce the Sub Junior competition from three grades to only two just prior to the season starting; therefore we had extra players in nearly all of our junior divisions. The Club also ran the Net Set program with around 15 participants.

Recognition must go to the coaches and other volunteers who gave their time to prepare for trials and then pre-season. There were some difficult decisions made at the Committee level in relation to the movement of some players into different grades with our focus on providing even game time and skill development. We may not have got this 100% right for everyone, but we did look at multiple options and implemented a plan we thought would work for this season.

It was very pleasing to see that we were competitive across all the divisions and the Club provided more opportunities for younger players to play in higher grades, it is great to see such depth within the Club. The potential in our Junior divisions will ensure that the club has a bright future, and with the ability to retain these players into senior teams where the players can take their skills to the next level. This in turn will see us more competitive and show other Clubs that over the next two to three seasons that we will be a strong club.

We had six teams play in the finals (Senior 3 & 6, Inter 2, Junior 2, Sub Junior 1 & 2) with three teams playing on Grand Final day (Inter 2 and both Sub Junior teams). Congratulations to all the teams who made finals, it is a very good indicator of the Club's growth. A special mention goes to the Sub Junior 2 team who won their match to be Premiers and to Emily Rosenzweig who was awarded Best on Court during the game. In addition, our Primary 1 team were presented with Association medallions for being  $2^{nd}$  in their grade.

Congratulations to our players who represented the Association in Country Champs (Abbey Auricht, Lottie Higgins, Erin Schick and Stacey Thom) and in the Regional Academy team (Chloe Petersen). Congratulations to all those players who received Association Awards - Best & Fairest and B&F Runner Up trophies: Lara Manning, Letisha Bartsch, Abbey Auricht, Chloe Petersen & Belinda Petersen, with Chloe Petersen also receiving the Association Inter 1 Netballer of the Year award. We are very proud of your achievements.

I must not forget to thank our umpires and our Umpire Co-ordinator, Bundy, without you there is no game. Thanks for all of those that umpired and great to see some junior players taking on umpiring a competition match for the first time this season. Keep up the good work. Well done Gab Marschall for obtaining your National C Badge.

Thanks must go to the coaches and other volunteers who give their time to coach or be a team manager or primary carer of the teams. Parents and supporters are fundamental for getting the teams playing each week also, with scoring and timing duties. This season we also needed a helper with some of the COVID19 cleaning requirements and Marshal for each match - a big shout out must go to you.

I also need to acknowledge our Sponsors, the support from you during this difficult time is very much appreciated and I look forward to the continued support for many years to come. Thanks to Mel who spends many hours visiting businesses to seek out sponsorship, your efforts are very much appreciated too. This season's sponsor's day was a smaller event than past years, but everyone who attended had a great time. Thanks to everyone involved in the preparation of the day.

We also got some extra help for court set up on home matches, thanks to Dan, Andrew & Trent. It is great to see others getting involved in any way they can.

Congratulations to all the players who had milestone games this year; Charlotte Bosward, Stacey Thom, Nikia Goers, Ash Fox, Nicole Owen and Mel Skarstrom.

Also Congratulations to the Club trophy winners this year, with a special mention to Mel Skarstrom who was presented with the Club Service Award and Life Membership being awarded to Kristin Falkenberg. Well deserved to all.

The Club has some great people who are working hard to develop the Club on and off the court and to maintain a solid financial position. We have been successful in getting some grants from Office of Recreation, Sport & Racing – and we have used these funds to purchase new balls and training equipment. We will continue to apply for grants that will benefit the progression of the Club.

In relation to the next stage of development for Tanunda Rec Park, the extension of the oval, creation of a junior oval, new entrance to the Park and updated playground areas, please be patient whilst there might be times when access to the oval/courts may be impacted due to the development works.

To the Committee members, thank you for your support during the season and particularly to Kirsten & Amanda for filling a couple of spots for a few months. Thanks to Rosie for taking on some extra roles this season – canteen roster co-ordinator & Treasurer as well as coaching. The contributions of everyone on the committee no matter how big or small are very appreciated as every little bit helps.

Our focus for 2022 will be to build on the great platform from the 2021 season - to apply ourselves and dig deep and grab any opportunities that arise. Striving to build on our values and goals and to be positive and encouraging all of our members. Showing dedication and commitment to help the club – whether it be umpiring more games throughout the season or volunteering for canteen duties, volunteering to be a coach or team manager or just lending a hand on match day, everyone should be proud to be part of Tanunda Netball Club. We can create a sense of belonging at our club, where it feels like a big family, and we are surrounded with like-minded individuals – who just love netball!

### TANUNDA NETBALL CLUB LIFE MEMBERSHIP PRESENTED TO

### Kristen Falkenberg

Friday 15<sup>th</sup> October 2021

Each season the Tanunda Netball Club recognises players who have performed well over the season. We celebrate premierships, we recognise our umpires and we give awards for Club service. The highest honour anyone can receive is a Life Membership. Currently the Club has awarded 22 Life Memberships. 4 Life Members are deceased – Kay Hueppauff, Edna Behrndt, Thelma Murphy and Marjorie Lehmann. We have 4 mother/daughter Life Members - Kay Hueppauff and Lyn Lindner, Kathy Marschall and Gabrielle Marschall, Marjorie Lehmann and Sharon Seedsman, Sue Martin and Toni Martin, awarded Life Membership in 2019.

Life Membership is about a long-term association with our Club and is not just about being a player. It is very much about service and connection.

Tonight the Tanunda Netball Club would like to recognise and award Life Membership to a player who played her first game for the Club in 1981. She played in Sub-Junior 3's and won her first Best and Fairest Award. 1981 also saw the Tanunda Netball Club win the Senior 1 Premiership. Just 8 years later she joined that team to play in her first Senior 1 Premiership. 40 years on she becomes the 23rd Life Member of the Tanunda Netball Club – Congratulations Kristin Falkenberg.

Kristin began her playing career when she was 10 years old. Our records are a tad thin during the 80s, especially when Kristin was playing in juniors. But the records do reflect that even in her very first year she was identified as having a special talent as she also played at least 1 game in Sub-Junior 2's, polling 3 votes in that team as well as winning B&F for Sub-Junior 3s.

In 1984 she played in Junior 2s where she played in the preliminary final. Despite fantastic coaching the team was unable to make the Grand Final. But she had her eye on the Senior 1 team who once again were Premiers that year, the third premiership in 4 years. Kathy Marschall had retired at the end of '83 and there was a newbee, outer-towner in at GK. Kristin thought she was in with a chance!

In 1985, at age 14, Kristin found herself playing in the Senior 5 Premiership Team. Thelma Murphy was the coach and she knew talent when she saw it. She obviously whisked Kristin out of juniors and had her mentored by a specialist in Lyn Hoklas. Kristin was awarded Most Improved that season. And in the background the Senior 1's won three from three.

In 1986 Kristin was picked up by the Senior 3 coach, Neil Tarca, another talent shark. We thought Kristin could not get a better mentor than Lyn......but coach Tarca had other ideas. She teamed up Kristin with the best of the best, Levene Fechner and other golden girls such as Carolyn Hataier and Kathy Gerschwitz. No surprise these girls won the Senior 3 Premiership this year and to top it off Kristin won the Best and Fairest Award. And in the background Nuriootpa finally won a premiership in Senior 1 having lost 3 from 3 v Tanunda.

In 1987 Coach Tarca didn't let Kristin out of her sight and the Senior 3s went through the season undefeated and on to win its second premiership in as many years. In the background, the TFC won it's third A grade premiership in the 80s but the Senior 1 netballers were unable to make the double. For Kristin, the time was right to make a move.

In 1988 Senior 1 coach, Kieran Roche made the big move and pulled "Harbo" into the Senior 1 squad. The team was in a rebuilding phase and Kapunda proved to be the team to beat this season. Kristin quickly gained respect within the association and the TNC Netball Natter correspondent for '88, Joey, nicknamed Kristin "Knuckles" Habermann. The Senior 1s played preliminary final v Nuriootpa and lost, with Kapunda winning the Premiership a week later. In the background, Tanunda was in a great spot as a Club winning Best Club in the Association.

You already know what happened in 1989 ie Kristin played in her first Senior 1 Premiership alongside other netball greats such as Marianne Kieboom, Celia Johnson, Robyn Horley and fellow Life Members Gayle Dawkins, Karen Fox and Jo Buck. Kieran was the coach and we beat Gawler Centrals 55 – 46. And not only was it her first Senior 1 premiership it was the first time both the TFC and TNC A Grades won the double header. It was a big week in Tanunda!

Kristin continued to be a Senior 1 player for the next 7 years. In 1990 Tanunda once again won the Senior 1 Premiership giving Tanunda 6 Senior 1 premierships in 10 years. In 1990 she won the Coaches Trophy. Between season '93 and '94 Kristin went from Habermann to Falkenberg. 1994 was another Premiership year and personally Kristin won the Most Consistent award.

Season 1996 was another history making year as the club won another double header, this time taking out premierships in both Senior 1 and 2. Kristin also won the Best and Fairest award this season. Celebrations took on a whole new level that year for Kristin and she was noticeably missing from the Senior 1 line-up in '97. She came back in '98 but took more maternity leave in '99.

In 2000 Kristin came back yet again and to make up for lost time decided to coach as well as play, a role she maintained for the next 4 seasons. In season 2000 she won Best and Fairest Runner-up, in 2001 the Senior 1's finished  $4^{th}$  under her guidance and in 2002 the team finished  $3^{rd}$ .

In 2003 she coached both the Senior 1 and 2 teams and continued to play. But it was to be a frustrating year for her as a coach with 14 players needed across the season to fill her team, her season report reflecting similar issues we continue to experience 18 years on. At the end of the season she called it quits, encouraging the club to make a change and to seek a new coach.

Kristin played in excess of 350 games; played 20 seasons of netball for her Club; played 13 years in Senior 1; played in 7 premierships; won 7 personal player awards for Tanunda Netball Club; coached 6 seasons, both junior and senior, has been a committee member and represented the Barossa, Light and Gawler twice as a senior player at Country Carnival.

Since 2003 Kristin has spent time supporting the men in her life and their sporting aspirations and throughout has kept an ongoing connection with the netball club. 2017 marked the beginning of a new era of cooperation between the TFC and the TNC and Kristin as secretary of the TFC helped forge better communications between our two clubs. Her obvious netball experience and connections meant she understood the netball operation as well as the football and she has been instrumental in this shift as Club executives work together.

2017 also marked a comeback to netball in the Senior 7 Dream Team which soon became a nightmare!

Kristin has certainly demonstrated she is a dedicated and loyal Tanunda Netball Club person. I have experienced playing in a team with Kristin and I have coached her. I know she is someone I can rely on; I know she puts team in front of herself and I know she gives all she can. She has demonstrated Membership of a Club is not just about playing games but also about giving back to your community.

Kristin - Congratulations on being recognised and awarded the highest honour in any Club, that of Life Membership.

The 2021 pre-season started in January at The Rex with good numbers attending. A 1~2 squad was selected and training commenced in February which was affected by the usual preseason disruption of Vintage and University studies.

Our aim for the season was to introduce the successful 2019 Inters team members to Seniors by their integration into the various grades with the Clubs experienced players. This process was to involve preparing this group for senior competition by improving their resilience and maturity. We understood that the first four rounds were against the competitions better teams which would be a test for our newly formed group but it would be a performance benchmark for the season ahead.

Unfortunately the second game produced our first major injury for the year taking a key player from the group.

For the first part of the season we struggled to get consistent numbers at training and availability for game day due to work and other commitments was sporadic.

We were continually rewriting our starting lineup however during the second half of the season attendances at training and on game day were more consistent which delivered improvement in individual and team performances.

The team showed obvious improvement against all sides during the second half of the season and compared to the results from 2019. This was acknowledged on more than one occasion by the opposition coaches who commented that the improvement in the style of netball was noticeable.

Congratulations to Stacey Thom who achieved 100 games for TNC this year.

Most of the players were willing and able to play multiple positions during the year which assisted with team selection. In particular Lauren Martin played almost every position on the court this year so much so that I almost forgot which was her preferred position.

A sincerere thankyou to Tracey Hoklas for her professionalism towards her role as Team Manager, for her mentorship of the goalies utilising her many years of Senior One experience, and also for her regular contribution to team strategy during the week and court side game day. A big thank you to Jo Buck for her support and contribution in the 2021 season planning and implementation.

Thankyou also to the many volunteers on game day who assisted with the team official duties. With this platform now in place I believe we can now move forward and progress further in 2022.

Season 2021 was always going to be different and took a long time to get here!! With two "preseasons" under our belts the girls were well and truly ready to play some netball by the time April arrived. The first half of the season was very much about a squad mentality as Janette and I navigated our way through player avails and seeing what our players were capable of in a variety of scenarios.

Playing Kapunda in Round 1 was certainly going to be an indicator game. We started the game well and kept the game interesting for three quarters but Kapunda came home with the wind to win comfortably. Round 2 we played South and suffered a similar loss compounded by the season ending injury to Rosie Smith. Round 3 saw us struggling to fill a team with unavailability and illness. Round 4 saw us select a side close to what our final team was to look like and to take home some points was special. Unfortunately Alex suffered an ankle injury which took her out mid game and she didn't resume her season until Round 13. We had another win Round 5 v Nuri. Always feels like a final when Tanunda beats Nuri. At this point we were still struggling to settle a starting 7 given availability and now injury. Harmony found herself on the injury list after the Nuri round and she didn't return until Round 10.

Having won 2 out of 5 games the team was feeling positive. We notched up another win v Freeling and closed the first half of the season sitting in 7<sup>th</sup> spot. By the time we played Kapunda in the second half of the season the team was starting to look settled and we were able to gauge our level of improvement. In Round 1 we lost to Kapunda by 24 goals. In Round 10 we only lost by 12. In Round 2 we lost to South by 28 goals and in Round 11 the difference was 15. Barossa at Barossa is never a good day and Round 13 we had another great game v Angaston, this time having a draw. We then had our mid-season Covid break and missing an opportunity against Nuri.

We played Willaston in Round 16 and they clearly demonstrated why they were in the top four. Round 17 was our game of the year as we dominated all over the court winning by 35 goals. To lose to the top team the week after by 24 highlighted we still had some work to do to make a top 4.

Summary.....we played 15 games, won 4, drew 1, lost 10, finishing 7<sup>th</sup> on the ladder, 2 games clear of Angaston and Nuri and Barossa only 1 game above. The Gawler teams dominated the top 4 with Gawler Centrals winning the Senior 2 flag in a close encounter with South. And there endeth the season.

Congratulations to the Senior 2 Trophy winners – Best and Fairest Lauren Hutton, Runner-up Best and Fairest Abbey Renshaw and the Coaches Trophy, which this year was a mix of votes, demonstrating team, loyalty and consistency, Jane Wilksch.

Thanks to all our supporters who helped with duties and especially those who did these duties multiple times – Annie, Dean, Bindi and Clare.

Many thanks to our committee who put in may hours behind the scenes to ensure our players have the opportunity to play each week. We are indeed blessed to have such an amazing band of people who look after all the admin throughout the whole year. There was a time when winter sport had a sort of recess but these days it is a committee which needs to be on its toes 12 months of the year. To these mums, players and coaches I say thankyou!

Season 2021 was always going to be an interesting one with the regulations set by the Association that players could only drop down 1 grade from where they played in season 2019 (There was no 2020 season due to COVID-19 restrictions). Fortunately, this resulted in a core group of 6 players remaining together. This was a group of players that I had neither played with nor coached before, so we had a clean slate right from the outset.

We had a strong pre-season, which included a trial match against Mallala. Unfortunately, this match resulted in the first serious injury for our team – ankle (Georgie Smart). Suddenly we were down to just 8 players to start the 2021 season. As a saving grace, just prior to the season start, Ali Wiseman joined the fold and we were ready to take on 2021 with gusto.

We began our season tightening our basic skills including footwork and passing. The girls quickly took to basic yet affective drills that enabled them to have effective and flexible footwork followed by precise passing. Having a group of girls who were ready and willing to respond to correct and feedback worked in their favour as a team. Effortlessly the girls held their basic yet important foundation skills of netball in the forefront of their minds, knowing it would make them stronger netballers. This meant it was not rare for the girls to have entire quarters of netball with no basic and unnecessary errors.

Each week presented a new challenge to the girls and gave them the opportunity to tighter their skill set and play in a way that was affective against the opposition. Tougher teams such as Angaston, Nurioopta and Kapunda gave the chance to tighter defence, strengthen our attack and play a stronger, faster and more competitive side of netball. Although we were unsuccessful in getting a win against Kapunda it was clear the way the girls were improving through the season was paying off.

Every training was predictable and structured, enabling the girls to be prepared and ready to learn new skills. With a tight grasp on the basic and important skills of netball, the girls were able to move onto new skills such as specific passing for the appropriate situation, set plays, pace throughout the court and understanding how to use space in the most efficient way. Each player had their own personalised grasp on these skills which benefited their game play greatly. By the second half of the season, each of the players abilities had flourished and the team had a range of set plays that they would use comfortably and strategically throughout game day.

We saw key relationships on the court that benefited the team greatly. The relationships between the defence players as well as attack were strong. Each players had a great understanding of the team they were playing with. Understanding of the team around them made their understanding of each other strong. All players relied on the team around them. Our strongest relationships were the way our shooters worked collaboratively together with ease. This created an effortless flow in crucial parts of the game. Talking on the court was an expectation that the girls understood. It was important to speak positively with each other and encourage everyone on the court through the entire game.

Installed through trainings and games was also the ways in which you can be a fast and furious player on the court whilst also showing grace and a respectful nature to the people around you. It is with great pride to say that each and everyone in the Primary 1 side is a kind, caring and considerate netball player. Not only to the officials and other players but also to themselves. It was a reoccurring moto, that if you believe in yourself, you can do anything. Confidence on the court begins at a young age and self-belief was incredibly important to us this season. We encourage our team, we put mistakes behind us quickly and we respect that everyone has unique abilities, this is what makes us a great team.

The strength that the girls all have in their basic skills of netball, enabled them to flourish into composed yet strong netballers. The continued development in a range of other important skills, helped the team to strengthen as the season continued. The hard work that each and every player put into the season paid off and we were honoured to finish the season with 2<sup>nd</sup> place on the ladder. The girls should be so proud of their efforts and all of their own unique contributions that made our team as terrific as it was.

This year I got to coach the Go 1 girls.

I'm not new to the club. I played and coached with Tanunda for many years. Its been fifteen years since I last coached, and I could not have asked for a more eager, skilled, determined and loud bunch of girls. They were even more keen to hit the court as for most, it was their first time playing official games and also with Covid lurking around last year.

This group of nine girls made it easy for me to slide back in like I never left. There was so much to tell them about what netball knowledge from over the years I could pass onto them. I couldn't talk enough. Trainings started with easy passing skills and drills, and by the fifth training they were even practising holding their players and receiving lobs. They even nailed the 'four corners' drill quite early on too.

Like all first games and never having played before, crowding on court was an issue. They all wanted the ball, all the time. It soon became obvious we had to trust our team mates to do their job in their space. We also had to try and get our shuffling feet under control. But in time, that came too. I couldn't believe by game two, against South Gawler, we scored around twenty five goals!

In Go netball, we have no scoring, no ladder and no finals. The funny thing is though, the girls always knew the score in their head, and some parents (and me included) were sometimes hard to contain our excitement on the sidelines.

Over time, and practising at trainings, games against the Go 2s helped us grow even more. Sometimes we even changed positions in that we were playing our own team mates. The girls adapted well to any position they tried, and some have already now found where their

We often practised our throw ins. Who should lead and offer first, who should wait a bit longer and when to do and not to do a lob or bounce pass. They learned they had to work hard for the ball. This year saw Kirsten Schiller and Bianca Wohlers coaching NetSet. We had 13 enthusiastic girls enrolled, ranging in ages from 5 – 6yrs.

The program was run during Term 2 of the school year. We moved back to Thursday afternoon training (from Wednesday last year) as there were some older siblings also training on a Thursday afternoon which made it convenient for the coaches and parents. We had a younger group of girls compared to last year, so we had to 'up' the fun a bit and work a bit harder to keep their attention.

Our focus was on skills at the beginning of every training. Starting with chest passes, one handed and bounce passes in pairs. We then moved into simple games and drills to develop hand-eye coordination, catching and throwing skills, footwork, balance and space awareness.

By week three we introduced the concept of changing direction (dodging) and discussed the rolls of attackers and defenders. This was the beginning of giving the girls a great understanding of defence, attack and the rules and positions of the court. By week five we were reviewing some key netball concepts (pivot, stepping, 4ft distance when defending, and the different passes). In week 6 we tried our first half court game. It was pretty loose, but the girls were able to start understanding how they could transfer all the things we had been doing in training, onto the court. In our last training, with the help of a Go 2 player to fill the 14<sup>th</sup> player, we played 2 quarters of a full court game. We got on the court, giving everyone a chance to play in one of their favourite positions (the goal shooters VERY popular), and fittingly both teams scored a goal. The girls were very excited to finish our program with pizza, drinks and chocolate thanks to Mel and the TNC committee.

The parents were very supportive of the coaches, and happy to help out with a couple of the drills throughout the season.

Overall, we had a wonderful time coaching these girls, their attitude and enthusiasm to the program was great to see. As coaches we were thrilled to see girls progress during the ten weeks. Thank you to Linda for supporting us in the coaching this year and organising certificates
for all the girls.
